ON THIS DAY IN CHRISTIAN HISTORY

JULY 24th 1725: John Newton, author of "Amazing Grace" and other hymns, is born in London.

Converted to Christianity while working on a slave ship, he hoped as a Christian to restrain the worst excesses of the slave trade.

FEAST OF ST. DECLAN OF ARDMORE

The 24th of July sees the feast day of Saint Declan of Ardmore, Co. Waterford. Declan was a pre-patrician saint, preaching the new religion and converting the pagan populace of Ardmore long before Saint Patrick ever set foot in Ireland. He was born in the 5th Century in Munster.

He was said to have set up his church around the spot where the 12th century "cathedral" and round tower now stand. Declan was a prince of the Deise tribe and had returned from Rome to convert people to the new religion. His supposed burial site, known as the oratory, stands nearby.
