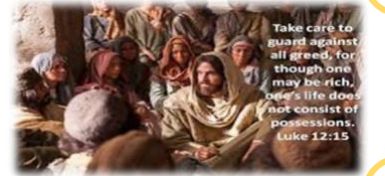

## POPE JOHN PAUL I BEATIFICATION SET FOR 4<sup>TH</sup> SEPTEMBER

The Holy See Press Office has announced plans for the beatification of Pope John Paul I, who was born as Albino Luciani in the northern Italian town of Forno di Canale (now Canale d'Agordo) on the 17th October 1912. Pope Francis will preside over the beatification Mass in Saint Peter's Square on Sunday 4<sup>th</sup> September 2022.

## ON THIS DAY IN CHRISTIAN HISTORY

**July 31, 1566:** Bartolome de las Casas, the first Spaniard ordained in the New World and "Father to the Indians," dies in Spain. He wrote several books detailing the horrors committed upon Native Americans by the Spanish settlers, and argued for the humanity of the Indians.

## ST. IGNATIUS LOYOLA (1491 - 1556)

The 31<sup>st</sup> of July sees the feast day of Saint Ignatius Loyola. He was a Spanish Catholic priest and theologian, who, with Peter Faber and Francis Xavier, founded the religious order of the Society of Jesus (The Jesuits), and became its first Superior General, in Paris in 1541. He envisioned the purpose of the Society of Jesus to be missionary work and teaching. In addition to the vows of chastity, obedience and poverty of other religious orders in the church, Loyola instituted a fourth vow for Jesuits of obedience to the Pope, to engage in projects ordained by the pontiff. Jesuits were instrumental in leading the Counter-Reformation.
