Can all parents who haven't already done so please return registration forms to the Parish Office, as the closing date was the 7th of October 2022.


CARE FOR THE SICK AND HOUSEBOUND

FEAST OF ST LUKE, EVANGELIST

The 18th October is the feast of St Luke. Luke was a Greek doctor who converted to Christianity. He was a companion of the Apostle Paul, and wrote his Gospel in accordance with Paul's teaching. He also wrote the Acts of the Apostles, which narrates the early history of the Church up to Paul's first stay in Rome. As a Greek, he takes care to explain to Gentile readers Jewish customs and the meaning of Hebrew words. The Catholic Church and other major denominations venerate him as Saint Luke the Evangelist and as a patron saint of artists, physicians, bachelors, surgeons, students and butchers.
