CHRISTMAS FAIR

Lorraine from our parish office is hoping to revive that old tradition of a Christmas Fair on the 4th of December in Beaumont Parish.

If you have any unwanted gifts or items, you wish to donate that would be in good condition for resale you can drop them to the Pastoral Centre between 10.00 and 1.00 Monday to Wednesday or after Mass next Sunday the 13th of November in the Pastoral centre. We also hope to have a freshly baked goods stand, we would welcome all donations on the day. All proceeds will go to the fundraising for the Church roof. If you would like to help, please contact the parish office.

BLUE MASS COLLECTION ENVELOPES

We recently introduced the option to place donations for the First and Second Collections at Mass in envelopes. This will allow the Parish to reclaim tax (up to 45%) on donations if the donor

- a) pays tax on income;
- b) gives €250 or more in a calendar year (incl. Family Offering, Dues, Upkeep Fund and Mass Collections); and
- c) completes a “CHY” form for the Parish Office which can last for four years.

Only one envelope is needed per week and it is enough to just write your envelope number or name and address. If you don’t specify how to split the donation, it will be divided 60/40 in favour of the First Collection.

This means that, for example, if a parishioner meets the criteria above and gives €10 on a given Sunday, €6 goes to the First Collection, €4 to the Second Collection and an extra €4.50 is given to the local parish in tax-back at no cost to the donor.

Envelopes can be taken home and placed in the “Secure Donation Box” at the back of the church or at the collection during the Mass.

Thank you for your patience with this new option. We hope that it can help to generate extra income for the Parish at no cost to those who already pay tax. Your kindness and generosity are deeply appreciated.

THE FEAST OF ALL THE SAINTS OF IRELAND

In Ireland on the 6th of November, we celebrate the Feast of All the Saints of Ireland. Pope Benedict XV beatified Oliver Plunkett in 1920 and during his papacy also the Feast of All the Saints of Ireland was instituted. The same Pope also granted Ireland the honour of having a litany of its native saints approved for public recitation. Only four saints, St Malachy, St Lawrence O’Toole and St Oliver Plunkett and St Charles of Mount Argus have been officially canonised. All the other Irish saints, such as Saints Patrick, Brigid, and Colmcille, are saints, as it were, by acclamation of the local Church. The scope of this feast, while it includes canonised saints, is wider. It also includes those who had a reputation for holiness and whose causes for canonisation have not yet been completed, such as Blessed Thaddeus MacCarthy, the seventeen Irish martyrs of the 16th and 17th centuries, Blessed Edmund Ignatius Rice, Blessed Columba Marmion and the Servant of God Matt Talbot and people like Legion of Mary envoys Edel Quinn and Alfie Lamb.
